In order to celebrate three years of successful International Anti-Corruption Summer Schools, IACSS, and to strengthen the IACSS alumni network in more than 40 countries on four continents, we would like to invite all alumni to a three-day reunion in Austria in 2010 (intended date: 27 to 30 September).

The programme of this International Anti-Corruption Summer School Alumni Symposium (IACSS Symposium 2010) will include guest lectures of renowned anti-corruption scientists and experts, fireside chats as well as meetings and discussions with participants of the summer schools held in 2007, 2008 and 2009. Side events and an in-detail presentation and visit of the first International Anti-Corruption Academy, IACA, will additionally contribute to the social and global dimension of the event.

As participation – due to capacity reasons - has to be limited to 100 alumni, we will distribute places on a first-come-first-serve basis. The enhancement of the alumni network and the exchange between former participants are essential elements of this IACSS Symposium 2010. Therefore, only qualified applicants of former IACSS modules will be accepted.

In any case, the organizer of the symposium reserves the right to accept an application.


The submission of a preliminary application does not give rise to a right to participate in the symposium. The final application procedure is expected to start in April 2010.
